The Sherborn MusicMakers, a group of women singers who have been performing in Metrowest for more than 30 years, will be guest artists in "Celebration 20," an original show honoring the 20th anniversary of Sherborn's beloved Community Center building, which began life as the Dowse High School and Sherborn Town Hall. The building, erected in 1858, has been the center of Sherborn activity throughout its long life.

"Celebration 20" will feature vignettes, connected by a lively narration, nostalgic and original music, and more than 100 photographs in Powerpoint, portraying life in the different eras spanning the life of the building. The MusicMakers will sing several Andrews Sisters' songs from the World War II era, while photographs of Sherborn's servicemen and women appear. Heidi Dostoomian will sing "Keep the Home Fires Burning," as the audience views images of the town's World War I heroes. Sherborn's Civil War vets will be honored both visually and in song. There will also be wonderfully wacky scenes and music when the story turns to getting rid of the bats in the cupola and deciding whether the old tin walls should go or stay.

Audiences will be seated at tables of 8, and refreshments will be available. It all takes place on the evenings of Friday, April 7 and Saturday, April 8, at the Sherborn Community Center, aka 1858 Town House, aka Old Town Hall, (where else?).
